As in previous years, Interior Community Services (ICS) has been busy developing, expanding, and delivering programs, hosting fundraising events, and fostering community partnerships. Many of our successes in 2016 were made possible through the support of our funders, stakeholders, and community partners.

A highlight for ICS this year was being nominated, and then recognized as a finalist for the Chamber of Commerce Non-Profit Award. This nomination was significant for ICS as this honor gives credibility and recognition to the work that ICS does in our community. Another major event this year for ICS was the purchase of the Mount Paul United Church building. This space will be used to expand food security in the community through the creation of a community food centre, helping to centralize current offerings of food programs.



Where the financial support goes:


Direct Program Costs 77.44%
